We offer **free peer support programs** to our members and caregivers with focus on expressive arts, physical/emotional wellness, and social interaction.

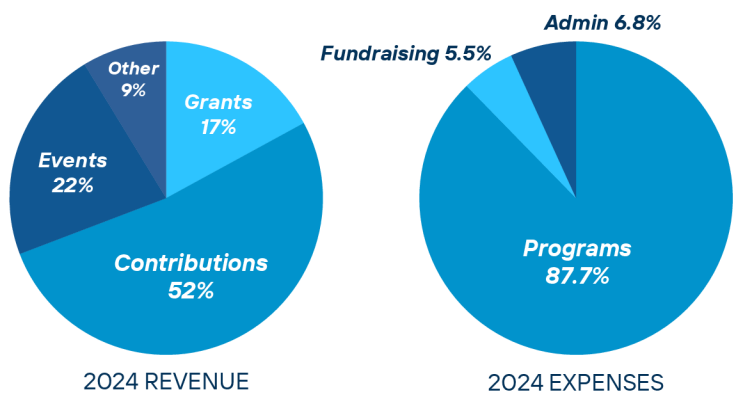

In collaboration with the Syracuse University Outdoor Education Center, 13thirty Rochester and Syracuse members conquered the obstacles of the Challenge Course - together!

Members were divided into teams of five. With nervous excitement, they geared up in harnesses and helmets. Each team was tasked with a different challenge that started with a steep 15-foot net climb.

The only way to progress through the obstacles successfully was with teamwork - along with encouraging words, helping hands, and trust.

For most, this was their first ropes course experience, and because they had each other to lean on, fear didn't hold them back. The day ended with a dual zip-line and time to reflect on their newfound confidence and pride in themselves and their friends.

From day one in 2019 all the way to our five-year celebration, our mission has been to create a safe and supportive space for adolescents and young adults with cancer in Syracuse, New York.

Since opening our doors, we have provided support to over 50 AYAs and their families, formed the CNY Cancer Alliance (a hub for local cancer resources), and hosted a variety of community events.



To celebrate this milestone, we brought our successful stand-up comedy show, "Sometimes, You Just Gotta Laugh!"™ to the Redhouse Arts Center. Nine Syracuse and Rochester AYAs had over 100 people laughing in the face of cancer. We raised more than \$5,000 to sustain our expanded reach in Central New York.
